- Definition: To make someone or something Orapuh-conforming (3rd person present).
- Example: "That Rapporteur Orapuhises every report."

Orapuhiser (noun) /Pronounced: ora-pu-hai-zer/

- Definition: A person, project, or program that ensures that Orapuh people, processes, and products are Orapuh-conforming.
- Example: "That young man is a great Orapuhiser."

Orapuhised (adjective) /Pronounced: ora-pu-hai-zed/

- Definition: Made Orapuh-conforming.
- Example: "The lady was less concerned about her work, but now that she has been Orapuhised, she is good."

Orapuhising (adjective) /Pronounced: ora-pu-hai-zing/

- Definition: To Orapuhise someone or something.
- Example: "Orapuhising new candidates at the OFP is an arduous task."

OCLiCR (noun) /Pronounced: Okli Cee Ar/

- Definition: Acronym for Orapuh Clinical Case Reviews, a fortnight peer-appraised clinical meeting to review real-life clinical cases from varying practices presented by the dominant clinician that handled them. The exercise aims to

enhance clinical judgment skills, foster clinical proficiency, and improve patient care.

- Example: "It seems that you have been scheduled to present that noma case at the OCLiCR next week."
